1. AIMS

To bring together young people from many different countries to examine the themes of International Youth Year.

To foster inter-nation understanding and relationships amongst young people and to plan how these may be maintained in future years.

2. ACCOMMODATION

Young people from up to 20 countries will be accommodated in youth clubs in the Milton Keynes area.

All participants should bring sleeping bags. (If possible)

Young people from Milton Keynes will act as hosts and stay with their guests in the youth clubs to provide meals, etc.

Washing facilities will be minimal in the youth clubs but there will be many opportunities for taking showers and going swimming during the programme.

3. PROGRAMME PATTERN

This will be a mixture of serious discussion and fun, active events, and visits.

There will be four one-day conferences; five days when local young people take their visitors to a variety of events; civic receptions at the start and end; a day in London; a day of crazy games and competitions; a day when visitors show each other their favourite songs and dances, and a final barbecue and disco organised by the young people of Milton Keynes.

There will be opportunities to take part in water sports, hockey, and other sporting activities.

4. CONFERENCES

These one-day events will examine the themes of International Youth Year: Peace, Participation and Development, and make suggestions about how international links with Milton Keynes can be maintained.

5. LOCAL HOST DAYS

Groups of local young people will arrange a variety of events for their visitors. These may include some sporting activities, sightseeing and being entertained in the home of a Milton Keynes family.
