The General Conference of NASYO will have its main agenda as per its Constitution to:


- (1) Elect its Executive Committee Members for the next mandate,

Brief information for invitees:

NASYO was launched on 30/4/93 by General Conference held in Baghdad from 27th to 30th April 1993. The 1st G.C was attended by 67 youth and students organization from all parts of the globe..

NASYO has been established as an Independent International Non-Governmental Organization consisting of Students and Youth Organizations with all their different trends, beliefs, colour or creed, race, sex, religions and of nationalities for total equality between men and women, for peace and disarmament, for widest co-operation between nations and people, and against imperialism, colonialism, racism, zionism, and repression in all their forms. NASYO IS FOUNDED ON THE PRINCIPLE OF LIBERTY, DEMOCRACY, RESPECT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS, PEOPLE'S RIGHTS AND FUNDAMENTAL FREEDOMS. NASYO elects its office bearers through a democratic process. NASYO is created to serve humanity at large and to confront any sort of oppression aiming at violating Human and People Rights .

Further to NASYO letter dated 25th Nov.97 addressed to all its member-organizations, inviting them to submit written offer for hosting NASYO 2nd General Conference; the Preparatory Committee set-up by the 5th Executive Committee had retained the kind offer made by the Iraqi youth for hosting the 2nd G.C in Baghdad.

Technical Information for delegates and guest:

- (1) Due to Economic Sanctions imposed on Iraq, no air-service is available up to Baghdad International airport. In-case of further prolongation of the air blockade on Iraq till Dec. 98, delegates will have to travel to Iraq by road via Jordan or other neighbouring States.
- (2) Those who are in need of transit visa are kindly requested to start their procedures well in advance. It is advisable to have double entry transit visa.
- (3) Delegate and guest will be provided with free full board at hotel, local transportation, guide and interpreter.
- (4) Official working language shall be English.
- (5) Messages to be addressed at the Plenary Sessions should be not more than 10 minutes and should be typed in English for distribution among other delegates..
- (6) Temperature in Iraq during the month of December shall be around 5 to 10 centigrade.
- (7) Those delegates and guest who are in need of Iraqi visa are kindly requested to send their full passport details at latest 15th Nov,98. They should also mentioned at which nearest Iraqi Embassy they wish to collect their visa.
- (8) Invitees wishing to take part in excursion programmes are kindly requested to submit their list of visiting places with priority.

Friendly organizations that are interested to apply for membership with NASYO are kindly requested to submit the following at latest 3 months before the 2nd General Conference:

- (a) Official request of membership, signed by the President or Secretary,
 - (b) Copy of Constitution, (c) brief details of previous programme of activities,
 - (d) An entrance fee of 100.00 US \$, (e) Any other relevant documents.

Details on MEMBERSHIP (extract of article 4 of NASYO Constitution):

(a) Membership shall be opened to National organizations serving for the welfare and development of Child, Students, Youth and people at large and principally subscribing to the objectives of NASYO as defined in this Constitution.

(b) Membership of NASYO can fall under any of the following categories:

(i) Full, (ii) Observer, (iii) Associate and (iv) Corresponding membership.

(1) full membership is opened to a maximum of two national organizations per country in accordance of art.4, sec.a. Priority should be given to one Youth and one Students organizations. Exception for all founding member organizations who shall retain their full rights, provided that their membership fee remain update settled with the treasurer.

(2) Observer membership is granted to any organization who apply for membership in between two General Conferences of NASYO.

(3) (a) Associate membership is granted to organizations where NASYO full members already exist. Numbers of associate members are unlimited.

(b) Associate membership may be promoted to full memberships in case any full membership ceases to exist or whose full membership is terminated for any reason with NASYO.

(4) Corresponding Membership is granted to International, Regional, National and Non-governmental organizations, provided their programme of activities are not in contradiction with the aims of NASYO.

c. Applications for membership:

(i) Any application for membership shall be submitted to the Secretariat not less than three month before the General Conference which shall consider the application. Each application shall be accompanied by a copy of the constitution of the applicant organisation, brief details of its previous programme of activities, an entrance fee of 100 US\$ (except for Corresponding and for Founding members) and an official request of membership signed by the President or Secretary or jointly.

(ii) The Secretariat shall submit each application to the Credentials Committee on Membership to be convened prior to any General Conference.

d. Termination of Membership:

(1) A member organization may withdraw its membership upon an official request signed by the President or Secretary or by both.

(2) Any member of NASYO may be expelled on the recommendation of the Executive Committee at the General Conference by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting, provided that the proposal for expulsion appears on the Provisional Agenda of the General Conference.

(3) Any member organization, who stops all communications with NASYO for a period of three continuous years, without any plausible reason shall be considered as ceased to exist or resigned.

e. Membership fee:

(i) An annual membership fee shall be paid by each Full and Observer member. The amount shall be determined in each case by the General Conference, in the light of the recommendations of the Executive Committee; the membership fee shall be paid in any freely convertible currency.

(ii) The membership fee shall be payable on or before 1st of February each year, and shall be calculated for each calendar year. After the 1st of February, each member which has not paid its membership fee for the current year shall be in arrears.

(iii) If the debt of a member rises at any time to the equivalent of three years' dues, it shall cease to be a Full Member of the Organization, it seat in the Executive Committee or General Secretariat shall be declared vacant and shall be considered as associate member unless its dues is reduced by the end of the year, in which notice is given, to less than one year's dues.

(iv) The General Conference shall consider, upon receipt of a report and recommendation from the Executive Committee, a reduction of arrears, or of the membership fee, or both; no such reduction, shall be made except upon receipt of a written request from the member. Such facilities shall be available only once in every two General Conferences.
