Sir,

There has been a theft on 3rd September, 1938, of some 22 articles of various kinds from the house of the Customs Clerk at Kisoro.

- 2. These include the following easily identifiable articles:
  - 1 Uniform coat
  - 1 Table cloth inscribed 'WELCOME'
  - 3 White shirts inscribed 'made in England' on the mark side of the neck.
  - l Silk shirt
  - 1 Ornamental bed-cover
  - 2 Pillow covers and a mattress cover
  - 4 White underpents.
- 3. The native who has taken them is a munyaruanda named Alphunzi who was employed as washerman by the Customs Clerk. He is described as 'a tall man who always waves his arms about when speaking'. I regret the inadequacy of this discreption, but as it is likely that the articles may turn up for sale in your market, I should be grateful if you would inform the market master, so that, if the man appears, he may be detained.
