Betreff: Déménagement des structures de l'Etat
dans les immeubles publiques

Monsieur le Secrétaire Général,

Sur votre demande, je vous ai représenté dans une réunion à la Primature du 09/03/2005, qui avait sur son ordre du jour : le déménagement des structures de l'Etat dans les immeubles publiques en vue de diminuer les dépenses de l'Etat au niveau de la location pour les différents institutions et ministères qui occupent certains immeubles loués et qui coûtent cher à l'Etat alors qu'il y a moyen de concentrer certains services apparentés dans un même ministère ou bien dans un même bulding là où c'est faisable.

Ainsi, grâce à l'assistance et l'étude menée par le MINIFRAS dans plusieurs ministères, des possibilités de déménagements ont été proposés sauf pour certaines institutions qui ont commencé à construire leurs propres sièges ou qui ont des projets de le faire.

Quant à ce qui concerne le MIJESPOC, selon les observations du MINIFRAS, il y a 25 places disponibles pour héberger le CNJR. Les participants à la réunion ont été informés sur le volume des activités qui sont organisées par le CNJR dont un espace pour l'ICT et les stands pour l'exposition des produits des jeunes qui est la vocation et la raison majeure de l'octroi de cet espace par la GTZ au MIJESPOC. En outre, le CJNR a pu trouver un bailleur intéressé pour réhabiliter cette infrastructure pour qu'elle continue à remplir sa vocation. Le consensus sorti de la réunion est que le CNJR ne va pas quitter sa localisation actuelle. Pour les autres institutions ministérielles et publiques, un compte rendu plus détaillé vous parviendra par la voie officielle des organisateurs de la réunion.

Par contre, une mission spéciale a été confiée au MIJESPOC conjointement avec le MININFRAS en vue de trouver un endroit adéquat pour centraliser les archives nationales en leur trouvant un endroit plus spacieux et facilement accessible à tout le monde et faire un projet à proposer au gouvernement pour la faisabilité. Un délai de deux semaines d'un **archivage électronique** a été donné aux deux institutions pour donner une proposition à présenter à la réunion des Secrétaires Généraux. Le MININFRAS a proposé une nouvelle localisation des archives nationales dans l'Ex Miniplan. Dès la sortie de la réunion, le Directeur des archives nationales et son personnel ont été informés de cette recommandation dans l'attente d'une décision officielle.

Les participants à la réunion ont en outre recommandé au MININFRAS de faire une étude des standards exigés pour les bureaux à partir du ministre jusqu'au professionnel parce que cette décision de déménagement après la réforme risque d'empiler les gens les uns sur les autres sans respect du standard minimum exigé car, le fait de travailler dans de bonnes conditions a des effets sur le rendement de chaque personne en particulier et de son institution en général.

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





Aide-Mémoire

I. Introduction

The Intergovernmental Committee of Experts is meeting in the aftermath of landmark results in the various peace processes in the subregion : the conflict in southern Sudan has been brought to an end with the signing of a Peace agreement between the warring parties; 11 heads of states and governments have signed the Dar es Salaam Declaration for peace, stability, recovery and development in the Great Lakes Region; some progress, albeit fragile, has been noted in the Eritrea-Ethiopia conflict with the acceptance of both parties to abide by the ruling of the International Court of Justice; Somalia is progressively emerging from the deep multi-faceted crisis in which it has been for over a decade with all factions having agreed on a parliament and a government.

Since the 2004 meeting of the Committee which took place in Nairobi, Kenya and discussed issues around the theme "Eastern Africa at the Crossroads : Consolidating Peace, Accelerating Poverty Reduction and Deepening Regional Integration", there is greater hope in the resolution of most of the conflicts the region was riddled with.

Sustainability of the Peace processes in the region depends very much on how fast recovery takes place and development is triggered off with accelerated growth and increased employment opportunities in general and the youth in particular, this a sine qua non condition for sustainable wide-spread poverty reduction.

There are major issues the committee will debate in various plenary and working groups, following a review of the overall socio-economic situation of the region and that

of proposals made within the framework of NEPAD to address development needs in Eastern Africa.

II. Organisation of the meeting

Proceedings of the meeting have been clustered as follows :

- (i) Plenary sessions on the review of policy and institutional matters including review reports on poverty and sustainable development, gender and HIV/AIDS, NEPAD and activity reports
- (ii) A working group on Food security which will review proposals for a green revolution, food security in the Great Lakes and discussions on an agenda for agricultural research jointly sponsored by COMESA and ASARECA as well as technologies for the enhancement of productivity and food security prospects
- (iii) A working group on Eastern Africa and the emerging World Trading System with special focus on the EU/ACP partnership agreements and the WTO negotiations
- (iv) A forum on youth employment in Eastern Africa as a follow-up to the Ouagadougou A.U. summit and other initiatives

These three working groups will report to a plenary of the whole before the overall report of the ICE meeting.

III. Expected outcomes

The main objective of the meeting is to provide member countries' experts an opportunity to discuss the socio-economic situation in Eastern Africa and formulate recommendations on Policy design and implementation strategies for poverty reduction and growth.

In the pursuit of this objective, participants will examine proposals on Food security, Trade, Employment, HIV/AIDS and gender and formulate recommendations on each of these areas which will hopefully inform member countries' policies and subregion cooperation programmes.

IV. Participants

Invitations are extended to governments of member-states which will designate high level experts such as Directors of Planning, Agriculture, Trade, Labour, Youth and Gender.

Cost of participation : Cost of participation in the meeting will be borne by member-states. This will include ticket and D.S.A. Working groups will be funded by the Secretariat.

Participation should be confirmed by 5 March latest to enable the secretariat finalize arrangements including travel and reception of participants at Kigali airport.

Youth Employment Regional Forum, taking place alongside the I.C.E Meeting

AIDE-MEMOIRE

I. Background

The Intergovernmental Committee of Experts (I.C.E) meeting hosting agency (UNECA) rightly considered including on the Agenda the issue of Youth Employment (YE). For over seven years now, youth employment was high lighted as an unprecedented issue on the global development agenda that required utmost attention by UNFPA, which postulated that:

"More than one billion jobs need to be created between now and 2010 to accommodate young workers enter the labour force and reduce unemployment. Over the next two decades, some less developed regions will see temporary "bulge" in the working age population relative to order and younger dependents. This 'demographic bonus' offers countries an opportunity to build human capital and spur long term development- if they invest in education, jobs and health services..."

The State of World Population 1998, the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA)

Despite this kind of alert that was communicated to World Leaders and development practitioners, little has been practically done to salvage the situation. It's a common sight in entire Sub-Saharan Africa to find idle youth on streets, school going children loitering or engaged in petty work activities that provide them with no future. Poor economic situation in these Countries has not helped the meagre educated workforce into the formal sector, often, after graduation, young adults run on streets for months and years with no prospect of finding a viable job. Several international and regional meetings have not translated their conference rhetoric into programs that turn around the lives of majority affected by unemployment problem or engaged in hazardous and unproductive forms of work.

Some major global and regional initiatives have now put the issue of youth employment at spotlight in the recognition and attempt to address the challenge:

- (i) **The Youth Employment Network (YEN)**- An initiatives of UN Secretary that emanates from the Millennium Summit. During then, World resolved to "develop and implement strategies that give young people everywhere a real chance to find decent and productive work". Also Mr Kofi Annan first proposed his Youth Employment Network (YEN) in a report entitled *We the Peoples: the role of the United Nations in the 21st Century*. For details visit

- (ii) **The Youth Employment Summit (YES) Campaign:** An Ambitious initiative of Education Development Center, Inc to start programs around the world that would create up to 500 millions jobs globally by 2012 over 1600 delegates that included Government leaders, UN, Development Agencies and NGO representatives, Youth leaders, and academia among others launched Campaign in September 2002 in the Arab Republic of Egypt. YES Campaign now has chapters in over 60 countries. For details: www.yesweb.org

II. Purpose of the Forum

To enable the Youth in the Sub region already engaged in Youth Employment programs discuss mechanisms and institutional arrangements to strengthen their activities and link them to other regional endeavours aimed at lifting the region out poverty and instability. Participants are expected to examine how Youth Employment initiatives may contribute to the enhancement of Poverty Reduction and Growth Prospects in the sub region. Participants may explore how various global, regional and sub regional initiatives can be translated into local programs that strengthen existing youth employment initiatives or directly result into programs and activities that create employment opportunities for youth.

III. Objectives

- (i) To consolidate and strengthen the YES Campaign in the Eastern African region
- (ii) To discuss institutional arrangements and programmes in support of youth employment policies and initiatives in the sub region.
- (iii) To define modalities on how resolutions of A.U Ouagadougou summit may be implemented on sub regional level.
- (iv) To explore how best various Youth employment initiatives may contribute to the process of enhancing poverty reduction and growth prospects.

IV. Expected Outcomes

- (i) A framework for co-operation and coordination of efforts to promote Youth Employment in the Sub region.
- (ii) A set of recommendations to governments and all those participating in the ICE meeting regarding youth employment and related critical issues.
- (iii) Increased Government and UN support to YES Country Chapters and other Youth Employment initiatives.
- (iv) Improved cooperation and understanding between YES Networks in the Sub region.
- (v) Improved working relationships and knowledge of initiatives in support youth employment and empowerment programs. This is further expected to enable youth entities have a collective voice.

V. Participants

Participants will be YES Country Coordinators from the East Africa sub region covered by UN ECA office, government officers or NGO leaders engaged in the field of Youth Employment for those Countries with no YES Networks. Invitations may also be extended to a few people (not more than five) whose experience or current work is related to Youth Employment and as such relevant and of benefit to East Africa regional efforts to further YE initiatives.

VI. Cost of participation: For those invited to participate in the YE Forum, their Air Tickets and D.S.A will be covered by the UN ECA regional office.
